

- Attend events that promote community, collaboration, and awareness.




# **OUR PROGRAMS**

All our programs are available to women veterans and their daughters (18-24). This includes reservists and national guard members. We also accept all types of discharge levels.



**Operation HandUP** – Operation HandUP provides direct services to homeless and at-risk women veterans. The services include emergency shelter, financial assistance, clothing, food, and transportation. *Case managers assisted 238 NEW clients in 2023.* 










**HerTOTALWellness (HTW)** – This 6-week program is designed to empower women veterans on their path to self-sufficiency by addressing their holistic needs. HerTOTALWellness is focused on three primary domains of wellness: Body, mind, and Economic Empowerment. *In 2023, HerTOTALWellness had 21 graduates!* 















**HerBIZ** – This is a 6-month program designed to walk women veterans through the process of starting their own business. They receive hands-on assistance in creating a business plan, setting goals, establishing personal financial stability, and applying for needed funds, licensing and registrations as needed, to name a few. The expectation is that each participant will have opened or be ready to open their business at the end of six months.

HerBIZ has 2 cohorts with a 12-month period. There were 9 Graduates in 2023!

**HerHEALTHYLife** - This 6-month program help women veterans realize the benefits of wellness. They are taken through workshops and exercise focusing on nutrition, stress management, self-care, and physical movement. *HerHEALTHYLife was not offered in 2023 due to funding. It will restart in 2025.*

**HerVOICE** – HerVOICE allows women veterans the opportunity to tell their story of military service, transition, and where they are now. This documentary will be available on YouTube and other media platforms to share with the public the lives of women who served. The intent is to educate the public concerning the accomplishments and challenges of women veterans.





**HerTIME** – HerTIME was created in response to the growing suicide rate among women veterans. The retreat provides 2 nights and 3 days of peace, reflection, and connection. It is intended to restore mind and body, reconnect to self, and connect with other women veterans while disconnecting from technology and getting back to nature through mindfulness and resiliency workshops, therapeutic art, positive affirmations, and fireside group sessions. *There were 5 retreats in 2023 with 22 participants. The retreats are done in small groups on purpose.* 

Our Social Worker also provides counseling in-house. In 2023, 448 individual counseling sessions and 21 group sessions were provided.












**HerSPACE** – HerSPACE provides emergency shelter and temporary housing for women veterans and their children. During the veteran's stay, they are assigned a case manager who helps them in setting goals and prepared them for permanent housing. Women are required to attend our HerTOTALWellness program depending on the week it starts. *In 2023, eleven women and 1 child were residents at the Lighthouse. 5 went into permanent housing, 3 moved in with friends, 1 into medical rehab, and 2 have HUDVASH vouchers and awaiting stable housing.* 





Women Veterans Recognition Week (WOR) is celebrated every year during the month of June to align with Women Veterans Day, also referred to as Women Veterans Recognition Day and Women Veterans Appreciation Day. It marks the anniversary of the day the Women's Armed Services Integration Act (Pub.L. 80–625, 62 Stat. 356) was signed into law by President Harry S. Truman on June 12, 1948. In 2014, Jacksonville celebrated its first Women Veterans Recognition Week to help bring awareness to the accomplishments of women who served, as well as the challenges they face in transitioning from uniform to civilian life. This week-long celebration was, and still is, the only one of its kind in the country. It draws women from other parts of the state and has prompted others throughout the state and country to celebrate as well.

- Second Annual Women Veterans Recognition Week
  - o Held Recognition Gala which now included Korea and Vietnam era veterans.
- Gathered women veterans and their families of all services to march in the Veterans Day parade for the first time.

- Held first community food distribution event.
- Held first Children's Christmas party at VA Clinic.

- Received a 3-year grant from Florida Bue to fund the HTW program.
- Moved organization to a new facility.
- Officially opened food pantry through grant from Feeding NE Florida. Received commercial freezer and refrigerator.

### 2020

- Launched three new programs, HerBIZ, HerHEALTHYLife, and HerSPACE.
- HerBIZ A program that helps women veterans start their own business.
- HerHEALTHYLife Encourages women veterans to live a healthier lifestyle.
- HerSPACE A 4-bedroom home was donated to us for transitional housing,
- Purchased equipment to host virtual meetings through Care Act funds.
- Held the first virtual HTW cohort. Cohort 14.

#### 2021

- HerSPACE program opened its doors to 5 homeless women veterans.
- Launched HerTIME program with 10 participants.
- Signed a SAM agreement with SBA.
- Appointment to the FDVA Fact Finding Committee
- Held the first virtual "HerVOICE" 3-day series.
- Received funding for HerSPACE Case Manager and a vehicle from Wounded Warrior Project.


