Over the past 13 years, our work has impacted the lives of over 4000 plus women who served our great nation. We have provided services to women veterans in northeast Florida and their children and each year, it seems the demand increases. With that local demand, we are seeing an even bigger demand throughout the state of Florida and other states. We realize we cannot serve everyone with limited resources and funding, so we have decided to offer services to women veterans throughout the state of Florida. We know those services are going to be limited but we will do what we can with what we have and do it without decreasing the quality of services provided in northeast Florida. With all this going on, we've decided to change our name to reflect a wider reach. "Women Veterans Ignited, Inc." will be our official name going forward. "Ignited" means we are motivated, determined, ready and willing to do greater work. We are growing in our services, our staff, and our responsibility to our community.

We cannot do this work without your help. Over the past 13 years, you have ensured our doors remain open and families are impacted. For this we are grateful.

Northeast Florida is home to more than 15,000 women veterans, representing all branches of service, every war from WWII to present, and every race and ethnicity. Many have successful careers and many are homeless, at-risk, or challenged to survive everyday living. We serve all.

We are the second largest population of women veterans in the state of Florida and the nation, representing 10% - 15% of the veteran population.

- Attend events that promote community, collaboration, and awareness.






OUR PROGRAMS

All our programs are available to women veterans and daughters of veterans (18-24) including those who served in the Reserves and National Guard. We welcome participants of all types of discharge statuses.



Operation HandUP – Operation HandUP provides direct services to homeless and at-risk women veterans. The services include emergency shelter, financial assistance, clothing, food, and transportation. *Case managers assisted 241 NEW clients in 2024.*











HerTOTALWellness (HTW) – This 6-week program is designed to empower women veterans on their path to self-sufficiency by addressing their holistic needs. HerTOTALWellness is focused on three primary domains of wellness: Body, mind, and Economic Empowerment. *In 2024, HerTOTALWellness had 6 graduates!*















HerBIZ – This is a 6-month program designed to walk women veterans through the process of starting their own business. They receive hands-on assistance in creating a business plan, setting goals, establishing personal financial stability, and applying for needed funds, licensing and registrations as needed, to name a few. The expectation is that each participant will have opened or be ready to open their business at the end of six months.

There were 6 Graduates in 2024!

HerHEALTHYLife - This 6-month program help women veterans realize the benefits of wellness. They are taken through workshops and exercise focusing on nutrition, stress management, self-care, and physical movement. *HerHEALTHYLife was not offered in 2024 due to funding. It will restart in 2025.*

HerVOICE – HerVOICE allows women veterans the opportunity to tell their story of military service, transition, and where they are now. This documentary will be available on YouTube and other media platforms, offering the public a glimpse into the lives and experiences of women who served. The intent is to educate the public concerning the accomplishments and challenges of women veterans.







HerTIME – HerTIME was created in response to the growing suicide rate among women veterans and to help those dealing with depression, anxiety and other emotional challenges. The retreat provides 2 nights and 3 days of peace, reflection, and connection. It is intended to restore mind and body, reconnect to self, and connect with other women veterans while disconnecting from technology and getting back to nature through mindfulness and resiliency workshops, therapeutic art, positive affirmations, and fireside group sessions. There was 1 retreat in 2024 with 19 participants. The retreats are done in small groups on purpose.

Our Licensed Clinical Social Worker also provides counseling sessions. In 2024, we provided 450 individual counseling sessions and 21 group sessions, totaling 482.5 hours of support for women veterans.










HerSPACE – HerSPACE provides emergency shelter and temporary housing for women veterans and their children. During their stay, each veteran is assigned a case manager who helps them set goals and prepare for permanent housing. Residents also participate in our HerTOTALWellness program to support their transition. *In 2024, 8 women and 1 child found refuge at The Lighthouse, with 4 successfully transitioning into permanent housing, 1 receiving a HUD-VASH voucher and awaiting stable housing, and 3 actively searching for a home.*










Women Veterans Recognition Week (WOR) is celebrated every year during the month of June to align with Women Veterans Day, also referred to as Women Veterans Recognition Day and Women Veterans Appreciation Day. It marks the anniversary of the day the Women's Armed Services Integration Act (Pub.L. 80–625, 62 Stat. 356) was signed into law by President Harry S. Truman on June 12, 1948. In 2014, Jacksonville hosted the first Women Veterans Recognition Week to honor the achievements of women who served and raise awareness of the challenges they face transitioning from military to civilian life. This week-long celebration remains the only one of its kind in the country, attracting women from across the state and
